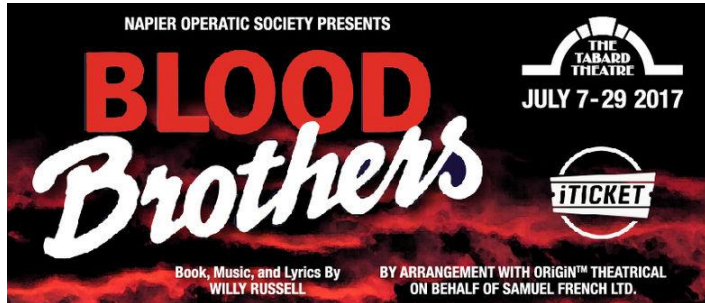

11.00am - Where Am I Going?:

Italian with English subtitles. Not many films can boast the near equivalent of *Star Wars: The Force Awakens'* 3-week ticket sales in its 1st weekend, but that's exactly what *Where Am I Going?* achieved when it opened in Italy earlier this year. Indeed this hilarious comedy now stands as the highest-grossing film in Italian cinema history, earning over 60 million Euros. Rated M

Italian with English subtitles. Multi-talented veteran of the European screen, Laura Morante (*God Willing*, LIFF 15), writes, directs & stars in this Woody Allen style film about a middle-aged woman who sets out to reclaim her life. The ever-luminous Morante also takes the lead role of Flavia in this snappy relationship comedy of words. Flavia is a bonafide psychological mess, still emotionally dependent on her 2 remarried ex-husbands & a human doormat to her so-called friends. With the help of a no-nonsense therapist – & a dog – Flavia negotiates loneliness & insecurities to finally stand on her own 2 feet. Integrating surreal fantasy sequences & directly addressing the camera at times, *Solo* is a sharp & entertaining examination of neuroses that showcases Laura Morante at her very best. Rated M

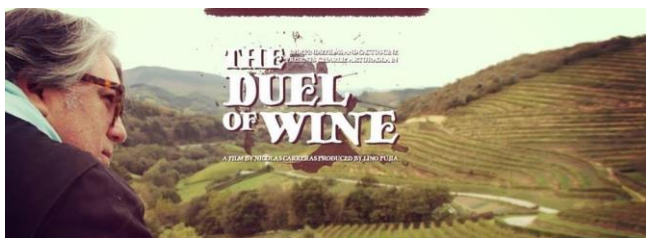
8.00pm – Duel of Wine:

David Fine Scholarship Exhibition: Te Ara Toi - The Path of Toi (until 29 July)

The winner of this year's prestigious David Fine Scholarship, Te Rahui Nicholls will be holding his 1st solo exhibition at the Community Art Centre later this month. Established in 2008, the scholarship honours the memory of David Fine - founding chairman of the Hastings Community Art Centre Trust, which was instrumental to the purchase of the Art Centre's building. The scholarship alternates annually between EIT ideaschool, & Te Wānanga o Aotearoa – Toimairangi.

Toimairangi Māori Art tutors selected Te Rahui as the highest achieving student who will benefit from the challenge of producing a body of artwork for a public solo exhibition. As this year's recipient, Te Rahui reflects a lot of firsts. He is of Cook Island & Ngāti Tuwharetoa descent, making him both the 1st Pacific Island & 1st male art student from Toimairangi to receive the scholarship. Painting on canvas & recycled native timber allows Te Rahui to explore various aspects of Māori art from kōwhaiwhai to cultural narratives both ancestral & modern.

The name of the exhibition 'Te Ara Toi' references Te Rahui's connection to his Pacific Island ancestor, Toi, who migrated to Aotearoa NZ, with settling descendants creating Māori art as they journeyed through life. 'Toi' is also the Māori word for 'origin' & 'art'. These notions are strongly reflected in Te Rahui's paintings as he himself journeys as an emerging artist.

More than 20 eclectic works will form this exhibition.
