

## **DECISION OF THE ENVIRONMENT COURT**



It is noted that the members of the Court who issued the original and revised decisions have since retired, or no longer hold Environment Court warrants.

A: The Hastings District Council is directed to amend Section 16.1 and Appendix 50 of its District Plan and insert the planning maps which show wāhi taonga sites (as set out in Appendix A).

#### **REASONS**

#### Introduction

- [1] In a decision dated 12 September 2015, the Hastings District Council made decisions on issues relating to what were then described as "waahi tapu" to be included in Section 16.1 of its Proposed District Plan (PDP). The Maungaharuru-Tangitū Trust (MTT), which had made submissions on the PDP seeking to identify and protect sites of significance, then appealed some of the decisions made by the Council.
- [2] Court-assisted mediation and discussions between the parties followed the lodging of the appeal and resolved a number of issues. The parties lodged a consent order in relation to those matters on 7 July 2017, with the intention that it remained on hold until the other outstanding issues were dealt with by the Court.<sup>3</sup>
- [3] The Court heard the balance of the appeal in March and April 2018, and issued its decision.<sup>4</sup> The Trust and the Raikes (s 274 parties) appealed the Court's decision to the High Court. The High Court issued its decision on 10 October 2019, remitting the Environment Court's decision back to the Environment Court for

reconsideration.5

[4] The Court issued a revised decision on this matter on 12 July 2021<sup>6</sup> and issued directions enabling the Council to finalise the plan provisions arising out of that decision. That decision was also appealed to the High Court. The High Court subsequently issued its decision on that appeal and leave to appeal that decision to the Court of Appeal was declined bringing the matter to an end.<sup>7</sup>

[5] Following that protracted history, the Council has now lodged a final set of plan provisions for the Court to consider.

#### **Provisions**

- [6] The provisions now lodged contain:
  - (a) the provisions amended by the 2017 consent agreement;
  - (b) further amendments made to provisions, as presented to the Court prior to the 2021 revised decision;
  - (c) amendments to the provisions to give effect to the revised decision (including the updated forestry maps, which were circulated to parties in 2021); and
  - (d) typographical corrections and various corrections to the legal descriptions of wāhi taonga sites.
- [7] We have considered the provisions lodged and are satisfied that they give effect to the parties' 2017 consent agreement and subsequent directions of the Court. The typographical amendments and corrections to the descriptions of wāhi taonga

sites are accepted.

[8] We order that the Hastings District Council is to amend Section 16.1 and Appendix 50 of its District Plan and insert the planning maps which show wāhi taonga sites (as set out in Appendix A to this decision).

#### Costs

- [9] The issue of costs was left open by the Court in its 2018 decision, but the Court indicated costs applications were not encouraged. The issue of costs was again reserved by the 2021 revised decision. We note that the 2017 consent memorandum recorded that costs were not an issue between parties with respect to the matters resolved, and were resolved with respect to s 274 parties Kowhai Downs (2010) Ltd and Rayonier NZ.
- [10] We reiterate that the Court will not normally award costs following the hearing of appeals on plans, in recognition of the participatory nature of making such statutory planning documents.<sup>8</sup> However, if any party wishes to apply for costs in this instance, they should do so within 10 working days of the date of this decision. Any reply to be lodged within a further 10 working days. To the extent that any matter is raised for the first time in reply, a response may be filed within a further five working days.

## Appendix A

# 16.1 WAAHI TAPU, WAAHI WĀHI TAONGA AND SITES OF SIGNIFICANCE DISTRICT WIDE ACTIVITY

#### 16.1.1-INTRODUCTION

The Resource Management Act contains specific obligations in relation to Tangata Whenua. It identifies as a matter of national importance the relationship of Maāori and their culture and traditions with their ancestral lands, water, sites, Waahi Tapuwāhi tapu, and other Ttaonga. The Resource Management Act also states that the principles of the Treaty of Waitangi must be taken into account when managing the use, development and protection of natural and physical resources.

Traditional Maāori culture and values are closely linked to the environment. Land confers dignity and rank, is the resting place for the dead, a spiritual base for traditional beliefs and a heritage for future generations. Taāngata Whenua have expressed concern for the quality and condition of resources and places of significance to them and where possible these are identified in the District Plan. It is these areas that are Waahi Tapu. TangataWāhi Taonga. Some Tangata Whenua and Council have endeavoured to identify Waahi TapuWāhi Taonga in the District, though there. There is a reluctance by Taāngata Whenua to identifydisclose the exact location of some Waahi Tapuwāhi tapu sites because of the need to protect their sacredness. Accordingly not all Waahi TapuWāhi Taonga or wāhi tapu in the District have been identified, although it is only those that have been identified which are protected by the provisions. To assist with the protection of some sensitive wāhi tapu taonga sites, the Council has listed such sites in Part 3 of Appendix 50, and has provided a general locator rather than a specific location for them in the plans.

#### Waahi Tapu sites Wāhi Taonga include:

- Old papā sites, excavations and middens (papā tawhito)
- Old burial grounds and caves (<u>urupā and</u> ana tupaāpaku)
- Current cemeteries (<del>U</del>urup<del>a</del>ā)
- Battlefields (<u>waāhi</u> pakanga)
- Sacred rocks, trees or springs (nga toka tapu, rakau tapu), waipuna tapu)
- Watercourses, swamps, lakes and their edges (waipuna, awarepo, roto)

The Council has recognised that the effective protection of Waahi TapuWāhi Taonga is dependent on the mutual goodwill of both landowners and Taāngata Whenua. Accordingly the District Plan seeks to facilitate the opportunity for this to occur as part of the subdivision and development process.

A Maāori legend related to the ancient Heretaunga waiata \*E to E to e to Ra'Rā' speaks of Te Whata a Terehunga, the name of a special storehouse elevated on a single pole to protect its sacred contents from the "gnashing teeth of hungry dogs". The Council's \*Waahi TapuWāhi Taonga\* Policy will act as a modern te whata or elevated storehouse, as a protective mechanism of these special sites, by identifying and collating this information for Council reference thus preventing the "gnashing teeth" of uninformed developments on these specific areas.

#### 16.1.2-ANTICIPATED OUTCOMES

It is anticipated that the following Outcomes will be achieved:

WTAO1 Recognition of and provision for Taangata Whenua cultural relationships associated

with Waahi Tapu, Waahi Wahi Taonga and sites of significance.

WTAO2 Protection of listed Waahi Tapu and Waahi Wāhi Taonga sites from the effects of land

use activities.

WTAO3 Active participation of Taangangana Whenua in the management of their ancestral land

and resources.

#### 16.1.3-OBJECTIVES AND POLICIES

OBJECTIVE WTO1 To recognise Waahi Tapu and Waahi Wahi Taonga sites and areas in the

Hastings District as being of <u>eultural</u> significance to <u>nga hapu</u><u>Tāngata Whenua</u> through whakapapa and ensure their protection from damage, modification

or destruction from land use activities.

OBJECTIVE WTO2

To promote the protection of Waahi Tapu and Waahi Wāhi Taonga sites and

areas in a way that accounts for the customary practices of nga hapu. Tāngata

Whenua.

OBJECTIVE WTO3 To encourage the partnership of the Council, landowners and <a href="mailto:nga hapu\_Tāngata">nga hapu\_Tāngata</a>

Whenua in the management of Waahi Tapu, Waahi Wāhi

Taonga and sites of significance...

POLICY WTP1
Identify, in consultation with nga hapnTāngata Whenua, land within the District

which contains Waahi Tapu, Waahi Vahi Taonga and sites of significance.

**Explanation** 

Landowners affected by the identification <u>or extent</u> of a <u>new Waahi Tapu</u>, <u>Waahi Wāhi</u> Taonga <u>or site of significance or a variation to an existing Waahi Tapu</u>, <u>Waahi Taonga or site of significance</u> on their property will be notified as part of the identification process and as part of any proposed District Plan Changes.

Where land in the District contains Waahi Tapu, Waahi Wāhi Taonga or sites of significance that have been notified to the Council and included for protection under the District Plan, these are identified in Appendix 50 and 50A and shown on the Planning Maps. These maps are designed to enable the Council to quickly and easily identify where there are, Waahi Tapu, Waahi Taonga and sites of significance on land Wāhi Taonga which may be affected by proposed activities, and when there is a need to notify nga hapu. Tāngata Whenua.

**POLICY WTP2** 

Notify and consult with nga hapm Tāngata Whenua on applications received by the Council for Subdivision Consents and Resource Land Use Consents relating to land containing a Waahi Tapu or Waahi Taonga site—Wāhi Taonga identified in Appendix 50 and shown on the Planning Maps where appropriate.

Explanation

Where Council receives applications for Discretionary Activity—subdivision consents, which separate an identified Waahi Tapu—Wāhi Taonga into two or more separate titles, or Resource—Land Use Consents for activities located on actual Waahi Tapu—Wāhi Taonga sites, the Council will notify the hapu Tāngata Whenua—Tāngata Whenua of Resource Consent applications where required.

For <u>Project Information Memoranda</u> (PIMs), <u>the-Tāngata</u> Whenua will be invited to provide to the Council any relevant information it wishes to have included about the sites on the PIMs. For Subdivision Consents and <u>Resource-Land Use</u> Consents the Council will invite Tāngata Whenua to work with the Council, and with the individual developers, to advise them on methods that could be used to ensure that the proposed subdivision, structures or activities will not damage, modify or destroy the affected <u>Waahi Tapu or Waahi Wāhi</u> Taonga <u>sites</u>. The Council may then, as a result of this consultation, place certain conditions on the <u>subdivision Subdivision</u> Consent or <u>Lland <u>Uuse</u> Consent, with regard to the nature, location, design or scale of the proposed subdivision or land use activity, including access or structures on the land.</u>

#### **POLICY WTP3**

Establish a schedule of key hapu Tangata Whenua representatives who will be notified of or consulted on applications received for Subdivision Consents or Resource Land Use Consents on land containing Waahi Tapu or Waahi Wāhi Taonga.

#### Explanation

A schedule containing the names and addresses of authorised contact persons Persons for Tāngata Whenua who will be notified or consulted about applications for subdivisions Subdivision Consents or land use activities Land Use Consents on land containing Waahi Tapu or Waahi Tapu or Waahi Taonga which are associated with their Marae, is available from the District Council. This will ensure that the relevant hapu / Tangata Tāngata Whenua representatives are contacted.

#### **POLICY WTP4**

Notify and consult with the Heritage New Zealand Historic Places Trust Pouhere Taonga on applications received by the Council for Subdivision Consents and Resources Land Use Consents relating to land containing a Waahi Tapu or Waahi Wāhi Taonga identified in Appendix 50 and or a wāhi tapu or wāhi tapu area identified in the New Zealand Historic Places Trust's register of Waahi Tapu and Waahi Tapu areas Heritage list/Rārangi Kōrero.

#### **Explanation**

The Resource Management Act provides a requirement for territorial authorities to have regard to any relevant entry in the Historic Places Register New Zealand Heritage list/Rārangi Kōrero to the extent that its contents have a bearing on the resource management issues of the District.

The Historic Places Act 1993 Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga Act 2014 also contains a requirement under Sections 32D & 33 Section 74 that councils must have particular regard to any recommendations given by the Historic Places Trust Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga in regard to measures the Council should take to assist in the conservation and protection of Waahi Tapu wāhi tapu.

As such the District-Council will notify and consult with the New Zealand Historic Places Trust—Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga for guidance on the appropriate measures to assist in the conservation and protection of Waahi Tapu wāhi tapu listed in the Historic Places Trust's register of Waahi Tapu and Waahi Tapu areas New Zealand Heritage list/Rārangi Kōrero for wāhi tapu and wāhi tapu areas potentially affected by Resource Consent applications.

#### **16.1.4 METHODS**

The Objectives and Policies will be implemented through the following Methods:

#### HASTINGS DISTRICT PLAN Land Owner / Hapu Tangata Whenua Agreements

In some instances landowners and hapu with kaitiaki over Waahi Tapu Tāngata Whenua may reach agreement after a full cultural audit has been undertaken on that site a Wāhi Taonga as to what type of activities can be appropriately undertaken on the site without threatening the integrity of the Wāhi Taonga. The Whakatu Coldstores site (Lot 2 DP24935) is one such example of this where a full cultural audit with Mmatakite walkover was undertaken in relation to a Resource Consent

for a new building. As a result of the findings of the cultural audit the hapu—hapū is satisfied that further building development on site provides little threat to the Waahi Tapu wāhi tapu, accordingly such building development has been accorded Permitted activity status. This does not however apply to other properties covered by W20 as they have not been subject to the same level of investigation.

That in the case of W38, historical records (including an archaeological site record V1/220 not specific to an exact area, although appears to align closely to W38) and oral traditions suggest that there are burials and Urupa urupā in the wider area. The land has been modified over time by horticultural activities, with extensive earthworks over W38 from the 1980s and early 1990s to remove the sand hills previously present. There is no surface evidence of burial sites, koiwi koiwi or urupā Urupa-present today. A Mmatakite walkover was undertaken on the land identified on the Planning Maps as W38 in July 2009, which did not identify any kōiwi koiwi on that particular piece of land. For the above reasons this piece of land is subject to less regulation as a Waahi Tapu wāhi tapu site. Agricultural, horticultural and viticultural activities are permitted given that the site has been extensively modified and previously used for horticulture. Any building activity would be subject to the Waahi Tapu Wāhi Taonga resource consent process. Reference to W38 therefore remains to acknowledge the historic and cultural significance of the site and wider area.

# <u>Section 16.1 Waahi Tapu, Waahi Taonga and sites of significance DWA</u> <u>Wāhi Taonga District Wide Activity</u>

<u>The Waahi Tapu, Waahi Taonga and sites of significance Wāhi Taonga</u> section includes a list of Waahi Tapu, Waahi Taonga and sites of <u>significance Wāhi Taonga</u> within the Hastings District which Council has identified the opportunity to protect and manage, through the use of Objectives, Policies and Rules, ensuring that consultation takes place when a listed Wāhi Taonga is affected by a proposed land use activity.

#### Section 19.1 Riparian Land Management and Public Access

This section of the District Plan identifies those areas of the Hastings District where Council has identified the opportunity to provide esplanade reserves and alternative mechanisms for the protection of waterbodies throughout the District to ensure the sustainable management of them and public access to them.

#### Section 30.1 Subdivision and Land Development

This section of the District Plan manages subdivisions containing Waahi Tapu, Waahi Taonga Wāhi Taonga, ensuring building platforms, servicing infrastructure and any development recognises and ensures that Waahi Tapu, Waahi Taonga Wāhi Taonga are protected from modification or any further disturbance.

# HASTINGS DISTRICT COUNCIL INFORMATION DATABASES

Including information held on the Council's Geographic Information System (GIS), to identify the general location of Waahi Tapu, Waahi Taonga Wāhi Taonga in the Hastings District.

#### **CONSULTATION**

The Council will work with Iwi and hapu Tāngata Whenua through the Hastings District Council: Māori Joint Committee and the Strategic Advisor Culture and Heritage (Iwi Liaison Officer) to establish contact persons for each iwi and/or hapu hapū (as relevant), through which consultation will take place. Council will notify the relevant Iwi/Hapu iwi/hapū contact person (as known to the Council) of any application for Subdivision Consent, or Resource Land Use Consent it receives which affects any Waahi Tapu or Waahi Taonga Site(s) Wāhi Taonga identified in Appendix 50 and shown on the Planning Maps, within 5 working days of receiving the application.

### HERITAGE NEW ZEALAND POUHERE TAONGA ACT 2014

In addition to the Waahi Tapu, Waahi Wāhi Taonga and sites of significance identified in Appendix 50 and 50A and shown on the Planning Maps, there may also be a number of Waahi Tapu Wāhi Taonga and Aarchaeological sites registered under the Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga Act 2014.

This Act makes it an offence to destroy or modify an archaeological site without first obtaining an 'archaeological authority'. This applies to both recorded and unrecorded archaeological sites. It is important that the planning for any building or development takes this issue into account and an archaeological assessment may be required. The applicant is advised to contact Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga if any activity such as earthworks, fencing or landscaping may modify, damage or destroy any archaeological site. An archaeological site is defined in Section 33.1 of this District Plan.

Compliance with the Performance Standards and Terms 16.1.6 and 16.1.7 does not affect any requirement to obtain an archaeological authority or otherwise comply with the Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga Act 2014.

#### **BUILDING ACT**

Under the Building Act 2004, Council is obliged to advise the Historic Places TrustHeritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga of any application for a Project Information Memorandum (PIM) within 5 days of receipt of the application, where the application affects any registered historic place, historic area, Waahi Tapu or Waahi Tapu wāhi tapu, or wāhi tapu area. The Council is required to include in every PIM any information made available to it by the Trust.

Within an identified Waahi Tapu, Waahi Wāhi Taonga or site significance Land Information Memoranda (LIMs) and PIMs that are issued will indicate that the area is a known Waahi Tapu, Wāhi Taonga or site which is of significance to Maori, and that the property ownerlandowner should take this into account when considering future development on the site.

#### **EDUCATION**

The Council will prepare material for the public that outlines the nature, and importance of Waahi Tapu, Waahi Wāhi Taonga and sites of significance to Iwi, likely places of location, the process of consultation, and which simple steps landowners can take to avoid, or minimise the impact on of Waahi Tapu, Waahi Wāhi Taonga and sites of significance on their land. The intention of the process will be to minimise any adverse fears that may exist about land with Waahi Tapu, Waahi Wāhi Taonga or site(s) of significance identified upon it.

#### MONITORING

Monitoring will be undertaken to ensure that the Methods outlined above continue to achieve the Objectives and Policies of the District Plan. Monitoring of the conditions of Resource Consents will also be undertaken by Council in accordance with Section 35 of the Act, and the Resource Consent Monitoring Strategy.

INTEGRATED
MANAGEMENT AND
INFORMATION EXCHANGE

To occur between all parties involved in the management and protection of Waahi Tapu and Waahi Wāhi Taonga within the region and particularly where the protection of Waahi Tapu and Waahi Wāhi Taonga is a cross boundary issue. This includes the landowners, Taāngata Whenua, the affected local authorities such as Hastings District Council, the Hawke's Bay Regional Council and any other affected parties where necessary. While the Hawke's Bay Regional Council is responsible for the beds of rivers, streams and lakes, this section applies to the protection of those rivers, streams and lakes that are Waahi Tapu or Waahi Wāhi Taonga.

#### **FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS**

Financial incentives including rates relief, waiving or refund of consent application fees will be utilised to encourage protection of cultural heritage including Waahi Tapu, Waahi Wāhi Taonga and sites of significance where appropriate. This recognises land owners and developers who provide for the protection of Waahi Tapu, Waahi Wāhi Taonga —and sites of significance on their properties and within the District. These incentives will be phased in through the Annual Plan process and will be awarded at Council's discretion in accordance with any conditions that it chooses to apply. Applications need to be made to the Council to determine eligibility to qualify for any one of the financial incentives provided for in the respective plans.

Rates Relief+totally or in partial—For properties or the affected parts thereof, provided the identified Waahi Tapu,

Waahi Taonga or site of significance Wāhi Taonga is maintained and suitable legal and physical protection measures are taken to maintain the integrity of the site in perpetuity.

<u>Waiving of fees</u><sup>2</sup>- Consent application fees for an activity on site(s) where a <u>Waahi Tapu or Waahi Wāhi Taonga</u> is identified and mitigating measures including physical and/or

legal protection of the Waahi Tapu or Waahi Wāhi Taonga is undertaken.

Refund of resource consent fees - Where landowners obtain Resource Consent recognising that the activity applied for solely promotes the enhancement and protection of the Waahi Tapu or Waahi Wāhi Taonga environment benefitting the wider community and that the effects of the stated activity will have no adverse impacts on the listed Waahi Tapu or Waahi Wāhi Taonga.

## TREATY SETTLEMENT PROCESSES

Through the various Treaty settlement processes occurring throughout the District, <a href="hapu-hapū and iwi">hapu-hapū and iwi</a> have been assembling information on <a href="Waahi-Tapu or Waahi-Wāhi">Waahi-Tapu or Waahi-Wāhi</a> Taonga to assist with their negotiations.

The nature of these negotiations and Treaty settlement processes means that timing of when such sites are identified may not coincide with statutory District Plan review timeframes and <a href="https://hapu.com/hapu\_Tangata\_Whenua\_">hapu\_Tangata\_Whenua\_</a> resources to participate in District Plan review processes, as well as Treaty negotiations, may be limited.

In recognition of this these issues Council will remain open to consider nominations for Waahi Tapu and Waahi Wāhi Taonga and sites of significance identified through Treaty settlement or other processes and may, in the future, propose Plan Changes where necessary and appropriate to incorporate such sites under the District Plan.

#### 16.1.5-RULES

The Waahi Tapu, Waahi Wāhi Taonga and sites of significance District Wide Activity section shall be complied with first, before any Rules for the relevant underlying Zone or District Wide Activity apply. Activities shall be assessed as a particular status under the Rules of this DWA (e.g. Permitted, Restricted Discretionary or Discretionary) before they can be assessed and the relevant Rules and Standard(s) and Terms of the underlying Zoninge or District Wide Activity apply.

The following table sets out the status of activities involving Waahi Tapu and Waahi Wāhi Taonga sites-identified in Appendix 50.

#### Note:

For some sites, particularly coastal pā sites, an archaeological authority from Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga under the Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga Act 2014, may be required for activities within the Wāhi Taonga. Such an authority is not automatically granted, and can be declined under certain circumstances, even when an activity is permitted in the District Plan or by resource consent. Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga should be contacted for guidance if any activity such as earthworks, fencing or landscaping may modify or destroy any archaeological site.

- a) The harvesting of plantation trees provided:
  - (i) A harvest plan is provided to and discussed with the relevant hapu/Iwihapū/iwi prior to harvest;
  - (ii) An archaeologist visits the site prior to and after the harvest to identify and record any further archaeological features or evidence that may be revealed during the harvesting process;
  - (iii) Trees are harvested in such a way so as to minimise damage and modification to the site.
- b) The replanting of a site currently used for plantation forestry, provided that:

- (i) A replanting plan is provided to, and discussed with the relevant hapu/Iwihapū/iwi prior to replanting commencing
- (ii) Replanting is at least 20 metres from the edge of the extent of the Waahi Tapu / Waaāhi Taonga.

# 16.1.7 B FORESTRY ACTIVITIES ON PROPERTIES CONTAINING WĀHI TAONGA IDENTIFIED IN PARTS 2, 3 AND 4 OF APPENDIX 50

- a) The harvesting of existing plantation trees provided:
  - (i) A harvest plan is provided to and consulted with the relevant Tangata Whenua prior to harvest;
  - (ii) An archaeologist and the relevant Tangata Whenua representative visit the site prior to and after the harvest to identify and record any further archaeological features, or cultural features referred to in the glossary of terms, or evidence that may be revealed during the harvesting process;
  - (iii) Trees are harvested and replanting is to occur through implementing best practice, including minimising damage and modification to the site.
- b) The replanting of a site currently used for plantation forestry, provided that:
  - (i) A replanting plan is provided to and consulted with the relevant Tangata Whenua representative prior to replanting commencing; and
  - (ii) Replanting is at least a 20 metre horizontal radius from the edge of the extent of recorded archaeological features (as shown in Appendix 50 Part 5 Forestry Maps) within the Wāhi Taonga, and those features identified in 16.1.7B(a)(ii).

# <u>16.1.8</u>-ASSESSMENT CRITERIA – <u>RESTRICTED</u> DISCRETIONARY <u>AND</u> <u>DISCRETIONARY ACTIVITIES</u>

For Restricted Discretionary Activities, the following identify those matters to which Council shall restrict its discretion.

For Discretionary Activities, the following identify those matters which Council may assess the activity against, but assessment is not however restricted to these matters.

- (a) The <u>significance</u>values of <u>Waahi Tapu and/or Waahithe Wāhi</u> Taonga <u>site(s) on the land</u>, including its value to Taāngata Whenua.
- (b) The extent to which Whether the proposed activity may destroy, damage or further, modify or adversely affect the Waahi Tapu and/or Waahi Tapu and/or Waahi Tapu particularly in relation to:
  - (i) the nature and scale of the proposed activity;
  - (ii) the design, layout or location of the activity on the site, including associated building platforms, vehicle access and services on the site—;
  - (iii) whether there are alternatives that do not involve destruction, damage, modification or adverse effects.
- (c) Methods to protect the Waahi Tapu and/or Waahi Wāhi Taonga site(s), including any recommendations from consultation with Tangata Whenua and (where appropriate) Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga.
- (d) Whether the proposed activity respects the <u>significance significant values</u> of the <u>Waahi</u> Tapu or <u>Waahi Wāhi</u> Taonga and will not <u>visually</u> dominate <u>or detract from</u> the <u>Waahi</u> Tapu or <u>Waahi Wāhi</u> Taonga.
- (e) Whether the contents of a site contribute towards its significance as Waahi Tapu or Waahi Wāhi Taonga and whether regard should also be had to conserving those contents.
- (f) The outcomes and recommendations from any cultural impact assessment undertaken on the effects of the activity on the Wāhi Taonga.
