The Loading Ramp: Application for a new class 4 venue consent

I enclose an application from The Lion Foundation for a new class 4 gambling venue consent for 9 electronic gaming machines at the **Loading Ramp**, 8 **Treachers Lane**, **Havelock North**.

On 5 July 2017 The Lion Foundation made an application for consent for nine gaming machines at this site. However, as you advised following receipt of that letter, there was no capacity under the Council's Policy at that time, and the earliest there would be capacity was from 29 September 2017, when the TA consent for a previous venue would expire.

You helpfully explained in your letter that while the Council would not be receiving applications in advance of 29 September, from that date onwards the Council would deal with applications on a 'first come, first served' basis.

- The Lion Foundation Grants List April 2016 March 2017 which includes all grants made to not-for-profit groups and community organizations within the Hastings District; and also a schedule for all grants (including declined grants).

- Payment of consent application fee of \$567.60
- The Lion Foundation Harm Minimization Policy and Minors Policy. These policies are currently held by all our venues. Sent via email 15/9/2017
- The Lion Foundation/ HPA template policy this is a recent initiative of the Health Promotion Agency and the DIA, and is intended to represent the industry "best practice" standard. It is not mandatory, but we like the clear messaging. It is designed so that gaming trusts can adapt it to their own use. This will be the policy that is provided to the Loading Ramp on opening. Sent via email 15/9/2017
- A copy of the Lion Foundation/HPA harm minimization power-point presentation. Again, we have adapted the HPA presentation and supplemented it with additional information that staff need to know. This training is provided to all venue staff working with gamblers and gaming equipment. (This is best practice, as the legal requirement is that there is only one person with harm minimization training on duty). We retrain venue staff every 6 months. Sent via email 26/9/17

Loading Ramp

The address of the Loading Ramp (8 Treachers Lane) falls inside the area within which a Class 4 venue in the Havelock North CBD can relocate (by reference to the relevant policy map). While this application is not a relocation, the address must, we presume, be considered a suitable location for a new class 4 gambling consent.

The operator of the Loading Ramp, Jarrod Lowe, has held a manager's certificate continuously since 1998. He has extensive experience in the hospitality sector and the Loading Ramp is a well-known and well-loved local feature of the Havelock North hospitality scene. Its customer base is drawn from the middle to higher socio-economic parts of the community which gives us confidence that the negative impact of gambling related harm in the local community will also be reduced.

Harm Minimisation

Our expectation and requirement is that the staff at the Loading Ramp undergo comprehensive harm minimisation training (and 6 monthly refresher training). The Lion Foundation and our Regional Manager Tony Goldfinch also work closely and, collaboratively with the local problem gambling service provider (Te Rangihaeata Oranga Trust) to ensure a safe, responsible gaming environment for all customers. We have included copies of our harm minimization policies.

The Health Promotion Agency, in conjunction with the Department of Internal Affairs has recently released a suite of training information for venue staff. The information has a particular focus on host responsibility and customer care in the gaming room, and includes template policies, powerpoint presentations, videos, venue signage and visual aids (such as cue cards). We are currently incorporating these resources into our own training programme.

Council Policy

The 2017 Policy retains the social impact considerations of the old policy regarding venue proximity to educational facilities, places of assembly, licensed early childhood centres and other class 4 or TAB venues.

We acknowledge that The Loading Ramp is within a 100m radius of the Havelock North Playcentre (estimated at 87m distance) and another class 4 venue (Turks Bar, 5 Napier Rd, Havelock North). These are factors which the Council must consider, but they are not necessarily determinative of the Council's final decision. Further, as noted above, the proposed address for the consent is within the identified parameters of the areas that gaming venues in Havelock North may relocate to.

Grants to date

We believe these 9 machines will contribute approximately \$150,000 in community funding for the Hastings District. In the 12 months to June 2017 the Lion Foundation have funded approximately \$744,000.00 to community initiatives and worthy causes within the Hastings District and we wish to ensure the continuation of this community benefit.

I write this letter to support an application from the Lion Foundation for a new class 4 gambling consent for the Loading Ramp, 8 Treachers Lane, Havelock North.

As the proprietor of the Loading Ramp, since it was built and started trading in March 2003, I would like provide the Council with insight into the thinking and motivation behind exploring the option of obtaining a consent to host gaming machines at my establishment.

From a purely commercial perspective, the opportunity to create a gaming room as an additional entertainment offering for our customers. The current layout of the bar includes a Function Room at the rear of the building; the demand for this area has not been great. The opportunity to utilise a portion of this space makes sense on a number of levels.

In my discussions with the Lion Foundation they have indicated that with the loss of the gaming machines that were operating at The Happy Tav, there has been a significant reduction in the availability of funding for the local community. As our customer base is drawn from the middle to upper socio-economic parts of the community, I am excited by the opportunity to re-establish this valuable source of community funding through the Loading Ramp.

I am also confident that with the resources and training provided by the trust, the Loading Ramp team will be able to effectively minimize the impact of gambling harm on our customers.

If the Council grants this application, I see this as having a really positive impact on our local community and any consideration the Council is able to give this application is greatly appreciated. 






Sections 14 to 16, and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act), <u>The Loading Ramp Limited</u> (the licensee) is authorised to sell and supply alcohol on the premises situated at 8 Treachers Lane, Havelock North and known as "The Loading Ramp", to any person for consumption on the premises and to let people consume alcohol there.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

Conditions

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

- (a) No alcohol is to be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1.00 pm on Anzac Day to any person who is not-
 - (i) residing or lodging on the premises; or
 - (ii) present on premises to dine.
- (b) Alcohol may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours:

 Monday to Sunday 8.00 am to 3.00 am the following day; EXCEPT THAT on the Thursday before Good Friday; and on Easter Saturday; and on Christmas Eve; and on the day before Anzac Day, liquor may only be sold between 8.00 am and 12.00 midnight.
- (c) The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in the application for the licence aimed at promoting the responsible consumption of alcohol.
- (d) The licensee must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed and must display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.
- (e) Drinking water is to be freely available and free of charge to customers at the following location while the premises are open for business: At the bar.
- (f) The host responsibility policy supplied with the application is to be fully complied with.
- (g) Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, in accordance with the sample menu supplied with the application for this licence or menu variations of a similar range and standard. Menus must be visible and food should be actively promoted.
- (h) The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low alcoholic beverages.
- The licensee must provide information, advice and assistance about alternative forms of transport available to patrons from licensed premises.
- (j) Each of the following parts of the premises is designated as a supervised area: Every bar.

(a) either--- (i) until the close of the period for which it was last renewed; or
